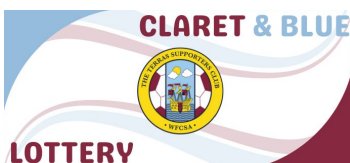

2026/2027 League constitution (from [WFC Fans](#) on Facebook)

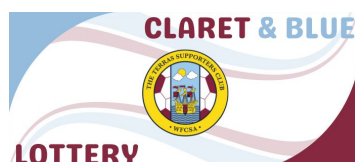


Pending any appeal, these are the clubs that are coming soon to the Bob Lucas Stadium next season.

This is a crucial season for the club as we look to get back on track.



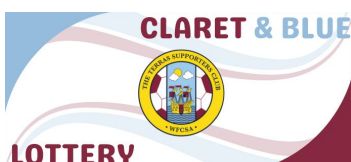
There are early bird prices available until the middle of June, with competitive pricing remaining in place after that offer expires.

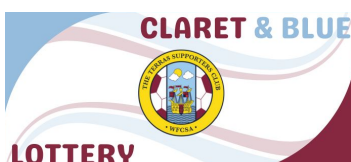
But what are they?
